Pentecost

Pentecost was an important Jewish festival which marked the harvest. Pentecost was celebrated fifty days

after the Passover. The disciples of Jesus had seen him after his resurrection and witnessed his ascension to Heaven. Those same disciples are staying in Jerusalem when a miraculous event occurs: *“The disciples experienced a violent wind and tongues of fire came from heaven and rested on each of the disciples – Acts 2:1-8.* Suddenly the disciples were able to speak in different languages to all the people who had come to Jerusalem for the festival. The festival of Pentecost is still important to Christians today because it represents the beginning of the Christian Church. It reminds them how Jesus’ promise that God would send the Holy Spirit was fulfilled. Today Christians believe the Holy Spirit continues to help them to live their lives and to tell others about Christianity.
